
CALL FOR NOMINATIONS TO CATSWA GOVERNING COUNCIL 2020 There will be 5 Vacancies on Council in 2020.




CATSWA BREEDERS

The super important difference between our own CatsWA Members and Back Yard Breeders is that our members register their Cats and kittens with CatsWA and they are thus PROPER pedigree cats with prestige and value. CatsWA role is to maintain the integrity of the pedigree and to promote proper breeding practices (as per the Australian Cat Federation Guidelines), which improves the standard of the pedigree cat and thus it maintains its 'worth'. THIS IS YOUR CATS' BIRTHRIGHT. THIS IS OUR JOB.

Our members, when they sign up and renew their membership, undertake to follow the Code of Conduct for Breeders (enshrined within our Code of Conduct for all Members). This includes proper registration of their kittens at the office on the Litter Registration Form, proper maintenance of records, and then proper transfer to kittens to new owners, via our Registration forms. The new owners then receive a CatsWA Registration and Pedigree as they are entitled to, when purchasing a Pedigree Cat from a CatsWA Member Breeder.

Backyard breeders may produce and sell kittens they claim as pedigree, but they are not.....

Cat Enrichment

Everyone wants to keep their cats happy, physically and mentally. How do we do it? There are many aspects, feeding, health, play and environment. This article focuses on play and environment.

Play is a great way to foster your relationship with your cats. They will love you for it. It will help satisfy their desire to hunt. Endorphines (the feel good hormones) are released when your cat catches the toy. I play with the cats by dragging strings along the floor, feathers and balls- my vans love chasing tennis balls, so I throw the tennis balls for at least 15 minutes per night. I also advocate walking cats on leashes. I made my harnesses based on the kitty holster, which can't be purchased in OZ... The Bengal and the Turkish vans love to walk. Boo, my Burmese, prefers to be carried on our walks, he doesn't like to walk, but does like to go out!

Another fun thing to try is cat tricks.. yes cats can be trained and really successfully too!! It works best if you have a food motivated cat.. which all of mine are! I chose to do training because I wanted to tablet my cats easily. They know if they get tablets, they get treats. I started when they were hungry and with one command. When they got it, I added a second and then a third. I watched my cats and when they got bored, I stopped. I do the training every time they ask for treats. They have their own "bench" (a kitchen trolley from Ikea) in the kitchen and if they hop up there, they are ready to do training and have treats. Mine have learnt high 5, shake and stop.. stop was for practical reasons when walking. I do reinforce with kitty crack – freeze dried chicken or roo from Raw Meow! I have read that Bengals will train well with a clicker- I haven't tried it as I have had such good success with treat training.

Then there is the environment. I would advocate having your cats exclusively indoors or in a cat run. This reduces the likelihood of being hit by a car, cat fights and illness. In rentals it is much harder to set up a cat run, but there are some great companies like "Backyard Cat Enclosures" which have sturdy, but not permanent enclosures.

Here are a few ideas for enrichment to get started with! These are all from my place and were all (most) done on a budget.



The quintessential box: any box will do! If I fits, I sits. My cats enjoy having scrunched up paper in the bottom.





Suction cup beds (Please ignore the messy desk...). These provide close company to me and a great out look for bird shopping. I mean bird watching. These are not expensive and available on the internet. These two have the advantage in that they don't cost much and they are not permanent, so if you are renting, they can be easily removed.

Vertical space is another important aspect of enrichment. Cats love being up high. In the picture below, I just got a plank of wood from Bunnings and some sisal rope and wound it around the plank as a scratcher and perched it over two cupboards. They are wedged into place and cat beds put on the top of both cupboards.



A mobile traditional option is a cat scratching pole. This provides a place to scratch, climb snuggle.



If you are inclined, you could turn your corridor into a cat climbing wall, which is what we did.. we used cheap ikea shelving boxes to form "stairs" and another Bunnings' plank of wood. We chopped up a foot mat for grip and claw sharpening and put it on all of the "steps" We used the sliding door frame as part of the high wire! It was tricky to get the cats off to take a photo!

If your cats are confined to inside, a fun way for your cats to burn off some energy, is a cat wheel. There are several on the market, this one is a ferris wheel. Pasha and Valentina are demonstrating how two cats can use it at a time. In my experience all breeds seem to love it. We have a Bengal, a Burmese, a Siamese and Turkish vans. All of them spend hours on it. Best purchase!!!



Lastly, but not least, cat runs and catios are a must! We have two and are intending to build a third. Outside we have added hammocks and ramps, which were made of left over decking wood. We have petsafe cat doors, so we can control who goes out when. That is not a necessity, but useful if we have a party or such and we can lock them out! Or alternative lock them in because of the weather- the vans head outside when its raining and I hate it when they roll in mud, or worse yet come in with hail in their coats!

CatsWA Policy on Inbreeding and Line Breeding

- **Inbreeding** is defined as 'the mating of closely related cats'. Closely related means brother to sister, father to daughter, mother to son and similar. It is used by cat breeders (as it is with all purebred animal species) as a way to produce kittens with predictable and uniform physical traits'.
- 2 However there are also problems with inbreeding cats in that as identifiable improvements occur so do undesirable genetic traits. These include immune deficiencies, major and minor congenital abnormalities, small litters, reduced growth and decreased survival rates of kittens.
- 3 Inbreeding is discouraged but not banned by CatsWA members, however breeders are strongly encouraged to research their pedigree lines for signs of negative genetic traits (which may be enhanced through inbreeding) before proceeding.
- 4 **Line breeding** is the process of breeding cats that are less closely related, grandparent to grandchild, cousin to cousin. It is a slower to produce kittens with desirable traits, but also has a slower rate of producing non-desirable traits, which enables breeders to take action on non-desirable matings.
- 5 CatsWA allows line breeding by breeders as a means of limiting the occurrence of negative genetic traits.
- 6 **Out-cross breeding** is the breeding of totally unrelated cats, or unrelated within five generations. The male and female are chosen to complement each other's good quality, type and temperament, and most importantly to introduce genetic hybrid vigour.
- 7 'CatsWA strongly encourages outcrossing as a means of improving health and hybrid vigour in all breeds'.
